

Wollaston Township - Coe Hill Agricultural Fair...The Show Place of North Hastings

Fair Books, Entry Tags & Ride Armbands are available at the Wollaston Township Office.

The Coe Hill Fair was founded in 1882. The first fair was held in Salem, two miles north of Coe Hill. The Second fair was then held in Coe Hill with the first exhibits in the Town Hall. The horses raced from the hall to the Cenotaph and back on the main street. In the early 1900s the Fair moved to its present location. A grandstand was built prior to 1920, partly for the Fair and partly to seat fans of the champion Coe Hill baseball team. Before cars became numerous, a special train came from Trenton each year.

Many barns and buildings have been added to the grounds. In 1969 the CNR Station from Coe Hill was moved to the fair grounds and set up for display. Over the years many new things have been done to better the Fair. The grounds are also used for many community activities, and are available to rent for private functions.

Wollaston Lake Beach

Wollaston Heritage Centre

Wollaston Township - Nellie Lunn Park

Nellie Lunn Park is a 100 acre parcel of beautiful land for community use. This area is accessible by way of the township road allowance off of The Ridge Road.

Signage and mapping of the trails through Nellie Lunn Park have been completed.

Wollaston Township continues to work with the Central East Sporting Coalition for future development of additional non motorized trails for hiking and mountain biking.

To visit Nellie Lunn Park, travel South from Highway 620 along The Ridge Road approximately 4km. A small parking area has been created on the east side of the road. Follow the trail markers into the park.



The McGeachie Trail

The McGeachie property was donated to Crowe Valley Conservation Authority by the McGeachie family. It comprises just about 500 acres of forest and swamp land, and includes two creeks, with beaver dams and other ponds. Birds and animals are in evidence throughout the property. Among the many animals are deer and moose, coyote, otter, with the occasional visit by North Hastings Elk.

The Gut

The Gut Conservation Area is located in the northern portion of the Crowe Valley Conservation Area watershed. It is a 400 acre site located southwest of Coe Hill on The South Road. This Conservation Area features walking trails, a parking lot, a look out area and a stairway down to the gorge. The "Gut" is a large gorge that the Crowe River flows through for about 230 meters. The fissure that forms the gorge is over 30 meters high and varies from 5 to 10 metres in width.

The gorge presents a breathtaking glimpse of this unique terrain.

Directions: take Wollaston Lake South Road. After 12km you will see Mission House (one of the oldest houses in the area 1864). Turn left at the steep hill on the other side of single lane concrete bridge over the Crowe River. It is 2km to "The Gut".
